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GPOC Update amidst Covid-19 Pandemic 2020

Donna Flaherty, PA-C, Director of the GPOC, reported that clinic sessions resumed at the end of May, after the center had been closed since mid-March 2020. Weekly medical clinics opened up every other Tuesday evenings, alternating with monthly Thursday and Friday mornings, all by appointment.

To minimize risk of infection with Covid-19, all clients are met at the door for screening by Center staff. Prior to each clinic, all staff and clients are screened for COVID-19, according to CDC guidelines, with a screening questionnaire and temperature checks with a touchless thermometer. Food pantry and medication pick-up, as well as completion of paperwork, is done with minimal contact risk. Masks are mandatory for all staff and clients. Disposable masks are available for those who do not have access to a mask.

As of this writing, there have been no cases of Covid-19 in Center volunteers or clients.

The GPOC is pleased to welcome new providers: Ayesha Tassadaq, MD, a family practitioner from the Dansville office of Tri-County Family Medicine; Nadine Bailey, PA-C, from the Cohocton Tri-County Medicine office; and Danielle Charamut, RN, a critical care nurse from Rochester Regional Health.

Many Center volunteers have resumed their volunteer positions. We welcome Pam Klingman, as the new Foodlink Emergency Pantry Director, taking over after the retirement of Donna Brian. Assisting Pam

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and empathy, but also opened her eyes to the importance of good family medicine and its ability to help people catch big issues early. Her transition to family practice offered flexibility for family life and the ability to follow up with patients. Thanks to all the volunteers who have contributed to converting the Geneseo Parish Outreach Center food pantry into an Emergency Foodlink operation.

Through Foodlink grant dollars, the Center has been able to purchase a commercial freezer and is in the process of procuring a commercial refrigerator, also with a Foodlink grant. This purchase will enable the Center to have available fresh milk, produce, eggs, etc. during this time of food insecurity for so many of the clients we serve.

A Community Service Block Grant (CSBG) emergency grant of \$7,500 was awarded to the Center to use for any medical expenses, as a result of the pandemic, for low-income Livingston County residents. The Center also received a \$5,000 grant from the National Association of Free and Charitable Clinics (NAFC) to help with the increased need to cover prescription medication costs for Center clients. Most recently, the Center was awarded \$3,500 from Livingston County Emergency Funds to continue to address the need for costly prescriptions and to purchase paper supplies and hygiene items not obtainable through Foodlink.

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Our Volunteer Hours

In the first six months of 2020 the Geneseo Parish Outreach Center volunteers donated 2,046 hours of their time. We recorded 346 volunteer hours in July.

Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Another opportunity for serving is to assist our clients with prescription expenses. In March alone we experienced a 500% increase in prescription-assisted expenses.

Listed below are the costs of four of the many drugs our clients need. Each represents costs for one individual per month.

- Lantus, a long-acting insulin commonly used to treat diabetes: \$223-\$744, depending on the dose the patient requires. The Lantus calculation is based on a patient using 30 units per day on the low side to 100 units per day on the high side.
- **Trulicity,** a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: \$689.
- **Symbicort,** combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: \$295.
- **Spiriva,** an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: \$439.

Sample donation and reminder: \$223 is equivalent to helping one person who needs 30 units of Lantus per day secure his/her much-needed medication. If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision would weaken them and could cost us all in higher emergency room costs.

If you or your organization can support shelf items and/ or medications, please respond to the GPOC ASAP with your wishes.

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The Geneseo Parish Outreach Center earned a 2020 Silver Rating from the National Association of Free & Charitable Clinics (NAFC) Quality Standards Program. We earned this rating by attesting that we have certain policies and procedures in place to provide quality care for our patients.
