

To all our Volunteers at the Geneseo Parish Outreach Center,

We have weathered, by far, the most challenging year in our history. Many of you have experienced loss: of loved ones who are gone; of precious time with family and friends; of financial security; and of peace and safety due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Yet God is faithful. The Outreach Center has been able to serve the needs of so many of our neighbors. We have ensured that our patients still have prescription medications, needed dental, vision and other specialty care. Except for a short period in the spring, we have been able to keep the weekly medical clinics staffed and operational. Our Foodlink Emergency Pantry has been able to expand our stock, not only with fresh and frozen produce, frozen meats, and poultry, but also paper products, hygiene items and infant supplies.

Yes, God is faithful. We have not turned anyone away due to lack of funds in 2020. Our financial situation has even improved, having received emergency grant funds and an increase in donations from members of our community.

As many of you may know, Dr. Paul Frame has moved closer to family in Maryland. He has served as our Medical Director for several years. But God is faithful. Dr. Ayesha Tasaddaq began volunteering this summer. She has graciously accepted the role of Medical Director in 2021.

For many of you, it has not been prudent for you to physically be at the Center. However, I know that you have been praying, and many have been able to carry on their duties from home or after clinic hours. Thank you for your faithfulness.

I wish all of you a very Merry Christmas and a much better New Year.

Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Another opportunity for serving is to assist our clients with prescription expenses. In March alone we experienced a 500% increase in prescription-assisted expenses.

Listed below are the costs of four of the many drugs our clients need. Each represents costs for one individual per month.

- Lantus, a long-acting insulin commonly used to treat diabetes: \$223-\$744, depending on the dose the patient requires. The Lantus calculation is based on a patient using 30 units per day on the low side to 100 units per day on the high side.
- **Trulicity,** a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: \$689.
- **Symbicort,** combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: \$295.
- **Spiriva,** an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: \$439.

Sample donation and reminder: \$223 is equivalent to helping one person who needs 30 units of Lantus per day secure his/her much-needed medication. If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision would weaken them and could cost us all in higher emergency room costs.

If you or your organization can support shelf items and/or medications, please respond to the GPOC ASAP with your wishes.

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Current Happenings at the GPOC Food Pantry

One important component of the GPOC is the Food Pantry. We help feed and supplement our community families with necessary food and household cleaning supplies as well as some hygiene products. Many of our clients are working and trying to make ends meet. Some are underserved by state programs.

We offer, at no cost to families, meats, fresh produce (when available), canned goods, fruits, veggies, etc., as well as cupboard staples like cereal, peanut butter, jelly, spaghetti sauce, and other foods. At times the Food Pantry will get needed donations from Barilla and Wegmans. Sometimes, Jerry Weaver. brings surprises from the "bread run" like pies and fancy desserts. These products are placed out for clients to take home with their food bags.

We have paired with Foodlink out of Rochester, NY, that helps us supply a variety of needed foods to our clients. This connection is paid for through grants and donations from churches, individuals in the community, and civic organizations.

For the past quarter, September through December 2020, our pantry has served 240 families, handing out a count of 703 grocery bags full of food, breads, and hygiene products. These numbers include an extra 50 families served for the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays.

We have a great crew that volunteers their hearts and time to the GPOC, serving in a variety of ways, from doctors to drivers and everything in between. We all come together to help others using our God given talents to serve others.

CENTER UPDATE

The COVID-19 pandemic has presented challenges no one could have imagined at this time last year. The GPOC has weathered these obstacles, however, and continues to be here to serve our clients and the greater community.

WELCOME to Dr. Ayesha Tasaddaq!! After volunteering this summer, Dr. Tasaddaq has graciously accepted the role of Medical Director beginning in 2021. She takes over for Dr. Paul Frame, who served as Medical Director for many years. Dr. Frame has relocated to Maryland to be closer to his family. Thank you, Dr. Frame!

The Center has been able to serve the needs of many of our neighbors, assisting them with prescription costs, dental and vision care and other specialty referrals, as well as needed laboratory and radiology services.

The Center conducted weekly medical clinics in 2020 except for a short period of time in the spring. We have not had to turn anyone away due to lack of funds. Between October 1, 2020, when the new fiscal year for our Community Service Block Grant (CSBG) began and the beginning of 2021, we had already assisted 67 qualified, low income individuals. A total of 98 clients had been served during this same time period.

Note that the Center will hold three clinics a month during the winter instead of four.

The Center's Foodlink Emergency Pantry has been able to expand our stock with fresh and frozen produce, meats and poultry, as well as paper, personal hygiene and infant supplies. The demand has been very high in this time of pandemic job and food insecurity.

A big thank you to all our volunteers, providers and generous members of the community, who have blessed us with their time, talents and monetary donations.

The Board of Directors Welcome Four New Members – January 2021

Dr. Ayesha Tasaddaq, our new Medical Director, and Pam Klingman, our Food Pantry Coordinator, are joining the Board of Directors this month. We also welcome Timothy Peterson, Director of Compliance for UR Noyes, and Donna Keller, Area Manager of the Pharmacy at Wegmans Geneseo, to the Board. Their backgrounds and experiences will be invaluable to the Board. We thank them all for volunteering their time and talents.
