Executive Director's Report

October 2024

Clinic Statistics -Since January 1 2024, we have served 215 individuals, 96 since July 1.

118 CSBG; 81 United Way of Monroe and GLOW region; 6 from UW of Southern Tier; 31 Excellus

28 Amish; 2 Homeless; 16 Migrants; 62 Disabled; 55 without insurance; 47 Unemployed

95 Referrals to dental, vision, podiatry and other specialties; 51 for medical expenses including laboratory and diagnostic imaging, counseling and other costs.

Dr. Stewart is staffing medical clinics on both Monday and Tuesday mornings. Nadine Bailey, PA-C continues to staff a month Thursday morning clinic for Hispanic speaking patients. At other times, I will see pediatric patients as needed.

Grants -

No new grants have been received. We are now using 2024-2025 CSBG funds, as well as UW of Monroe and the GLOW region (which will be reduced to \$21K in January 2025 from \$28.5K) and the UW of the Southern Tier, a small grant from FF Thompson and others. We have still not heard from the Mt. Morris Solar Ridge Community Grant application for \$10K. Other agencies have also not heard from their applications for this grant opportunity.

Volunteers – With the coming winter months, we will experience a shortage in available volunteers. We are seeking quality people for nursing and office staff positions. Data entry, computer skills are a must. Thanks to Katelyn Picard for her Facebook appeal for volunteers. In the last week we have had two nurses and two SUNY Geneseo individuals interested in volunteering. Before they can be utilized to their full potential, they will need to be trained. We may need to cut back on office hours during the winter months in the interim.

Training for volunteers – I continue to train individuals when there is time. I will be asking Scott Pickard to assist with computer training and our seasoned nursing and office staff workers to orient new personnel.

Five-Year Plan -

Transitioning to EMR has been a slow process. We will still need a paper chart for documentation of Proof of Income and the Financial Form for CSBG audits.

Delegation of tasks is an ongoing issue. We have a grant writer, individuals that do quarterly reporting for the CSBG Grant, and a very competent office volunteer who takes care of billing. There are still many tasks that need to be delegated.

Medical Director – Dr. Tasaddaq has expressed her desire to step down as Medical Director. She is willing to stay on for a few more months until a replacement is found.



Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Medications: If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision could worsen their condition and could increase the likelihood of more emergency room visits and hospital stays.

Listed below are some of the drugs most-needed and the cost of each 30-day

Lantus, (insulin) commonly used to treat diabetes: \$35 (federal cap)

Trulicity, a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: Trulicity 1 box is \$853.

Symbicort, combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: 1 inhaler is \$263 for the generic.

Spiriva, an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: Spiriva Respinat is \$150 for 1 inhaler.

Ozempic (injectable for diabetes): \$940

Eliquis (blood thinner): \$579

Xarelto (blood thinner): \$529


Trelegy (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$640

Breo Ellipta (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$277
