GPOC Executive Director's Quarterly Report April 2025

Statistics

We have served 93 individuals since 1/1/2025. 10 Amish; 15 Hispanic; 46 CSBG; 42 United Way MGLOW; 3 UW of Southern Tier; 8 Excellus. In 2024 we served 258 total individuals including 25 children. Therefore we are on the trajectory of serving over 360 individuals in 2025.

By County: Livingston – 68; Wyoming – 4; Ontario – 2; Monroe – 7; Steuben – 3; Genesee – 2; Allegany – 1.

Compared to the last quarter of 2024 – 82 individuals. 9 Amish; 17 Hispanic; 38 CSBG; 42 MGLOW; 3 UW of Southern Tier; 8 Excellus;

By County: Livingston – 59; Wyoming - 8; Ontario – 9; Monroe – 6; Steuben – 3; Genesee – 1; Allegany – 1

Grants

GPOC has submitted a grant to the Saunders Foundation requesting 50K. We should be notified sometime this spring. Mother Cabrini and Golisano Foundations letters of intent (LOI) have been submitted.

Volunteers

We have three SUNY Geneseo students who have been coming weekly. Their services have been very helpful with administrative office tasks.

Nursing staff will be given a refresher course in May on electronic medical records, which will include data entry and tracking.

We are still short-staffed in the office until May or June when a few of our snowbirds return. Staffing needs are being addressed by shifting volunteers from one day to another as need requires. Dr. Bernie Sweeney is now our official Medical Director as of March 1, 2025. We thank Dr. Ayesha Tasaddaq for her years of dedicated service in that role.

Migrant Workers

Due to the change in political climate, we have seen a dramatic drop in the number of Hispanic patients calling for appointments since January. We continue to partner with the Monroe County Archdiocese Migrant Center in Leicester to assist whenever we can. We have assured them that GPOC will protect their rights for privacy and discretion.

Five Year Plan

We are continuing to work toward our goal of paperless documentation. The next step is to streamline our financial systems. I have asked Melissa, our treasurer, to review our procedures once she is free post tax season. In addition, we are working toward cross training staff to address future retirements and attrition.

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GPOC GRANT PARTNERS

The GPOC depends on grants and awards to pay for the medical/dental/pharmaceutical, etc., services provided to our uninsured and underinsured clients.

Current GPOC grants and awards are as follows:

- The Mary Clark Thompson Community Health Grant through the F.F. Thompson Foundation, Inc: 2024 grant amounted to \$1,000. Past grants have been up to \$2,500.
- St. Paul's Enduring Gift Fund in 2024: \$1,000.
- United Way of the Southern Tier to service clients of Chemung and Steuben Counties: 2024 grant was \$7,500.
- United Way of Monroe/GLOW servicing clients of Monroe, Genesee, Livingston, Ontario and Wyoming Counties: 2025 grant is \$21,375.
- Community Service Block Grant (CSBG) from Livingston County: \$43,500 yearly for three years. We are currently in the second year of this grant.
- Excellus Blue Cross/Blue Shield grant: \$7,500 for 2024-2025.

It is the responsibility of the GPOC to be good stewards of these funds in our mission to service the clients who come to us for help.

Adopt-a-Shelf/Assist with Medication

As more individuals are temporarily unable to work, their ability to obtain food, personal hygiene items, and medications becomes more difficult.

Our pantry is well stocked, but we do not get a price break on items such as toilet paper, shampoo, and laundry soap. If you or an organization that you are a member of would like to adopt one of these items and keep the shelf for that item stocked, it would be most helpful. Just let us know which item you are adopting and we will let you know when it is running low.

Medications: If clients need to choose which bills to pay, they may stop taking their medication to save money. This decision could worsen their condition and could increase the likelihood of more emergency room visits and hospital stays.

Listed below are some of the drugs most-needed and the cost of each 30-day

Lantus, (insulin) commonly used to treat diabetes: \$35 (federal cap)

Trulicity, a newer non-insulin drug for diabetes which is injected weekly: Trulicity 1 box is \$853.

Symbicort, combination inhaler for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs twice a day: 1 inhaler is \$263 for the generic.

Spiriva, an inhaled drug for asthma or COPD, taken 2 puffs daily: Spiriva Respinat is \$150 for 1 inhaler.

Ozempic (injectable for diabetes): \$940

Eliquis (blood thinner): \$579

Xarelto (blood thinner): \$529

Trelegy (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$640

Breo Ellipta (inhaler for asthma/COPD): \$277

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GUMC Grows a Veggie Garden for POC clients

The Geneseo Garden Club has given an honorarium to our Parish Outreach Center in memory of their former member, Myrtle Merritt. The donation will be used to establish a vegetable garden using raised wooden boxes. These will be located near the south entrance of the church, on the back lawn.

The POC is seeking donations of manure and soil to begin the spring-time effort, as well as starters for tomatoes, cucumbers, summer squash, onion, and eggplant. Pam Klingman, manager of the POC's food pantry, is hoping that donors will contact her by leaving her a message at the GPOC (585-243-3120) to share their willingness to purchase any or all the above so that duplication of these plants can be prevented. Additionally, she's putting out a call for volunteers to be part of the work effort during the spring, summer and fall months, helping to maintain our vegetable garden.

This project will be central to the GPOC providing freshly grown veggies and nutritious food to our clients. This will all be done in memory of our church friend, Myrt, who helped so many while she was here on earth.

As this new mission effort gets underway, there are already some volunteers to "lift up." This includes Beth Feuerstein for her collaboration with the Garden Club; Dave Klingman for his help during the planting season; Board of Trustees who gave approval, which was a necessary step; and for Pastor Beth's acknowledgement and her support.

Pam Klingman will oversee the workforce schedule to accommodate willing gardeners. The sign-up time is NOW! Thank you in advance to our garden helpers for helping GUMC grow in its mission to help others!
